WELCOME TO IGNATIAN ADULTHOOD: A PROGRAM IN DISCERNMENT AND DECISION-MAKING

This module, begun in late September, concluded with a daylong retreat which was held on November 16th. 10 young adults completed the program. These are some comments from the participants: "I grew in awareness of God in all things. The different ways of listening to God were a great help." "I loved the Scripture discussions and found the exercises for prayer and discernment most meaningful." "The Practice of the Examen was the most thorough/helpful way I have ever had it presented to me!" The module is now being adapted for a general audience with hopes of taking this to one of our diocesan parishes in the spring.

THE SPIRIT OF SILENCE

A Reflection from Very Reverend Adolfo Nicolás, SJ

In his concluding speech at the recent Congregation of Procurators, Fr. General Adolfo Nicolas, SJ urged Jesuits around the world to recover the spirit of silence. It is a timely message for all of us in these busy times and perhaps the season of Advent offers a perfect opportunity to cultivate this spirit. As December days darken, the movement of nature is to withdraw in preparation for the replenishment of spring. The call is for us is to go within asking for the grace of open and silent hearts. The silence of our hearts is indeed a beautiful place to meet God and then, returning to our busy, active lives we will bring a softened presence to all whom we encounter, to all that we do in the name of Christ. Here is what Fr. Nicolas said on the subject of silence:

I believe that one of the primary challenges facing the Society today is that of recovering the spirit of silence. I am not thinking of disciplinary measures, fixed times of silence, going back to religious houses that look more like monasteries. Rather, I am thinking of the hearts of our men.

We all need a place inside ourselves where there is no noise. where the voice of the Spirit of God can speak to us, softly and gently, and direct our discernment. In a very true sense we need the ability to become ourselves silence, emptiness, an open space that the Word of God can fill, and the Spirit of God can set on fire for the good of others and of the Church.

More than ever, every Jesuit should be able to live like a monk in the middle of the noise of the city - as an Orthodox friend of ours once said. That means that our hearts are our monasteries and at the bottom of every activity, every reflection, every decision, there is silence, the kind of silence that one shares only with God.

May our observance of Advent result in quiet, open, silent hearts that inspire our every activity!
