DEEPENING OUR AWARENESS - SOMETHING TO PONDER

WHAT MAKES A LEADER, REALLY?* A Reflection by Chris Lowney

"Leadership" no longer brings to mind the one person in charge but a set of behaviors needed from every person. After all, the dictionary tells us that leaders "show the way ... by going before or along with." They "guide or direct, as by persuasion or influence, to a course of action or thought." ... I often tell attendees at leadership conferences to imagine four words stamped onto their foreheads: direction, influence, choices, and results. They are effective leaders ... by modeling those four words in whatever platform life presents them, starting with the platform they have right now. ...

Let's think about our seventy-six-year-old Argentine pope, for example. By some conventional measures, let's be frank, he doesn't seem so well prepared for what he has inherited. He has never worked in the "headquarters" he now oversees. We are living in a wired world, and in one book-length interview, he self-deprecatingly described himself as not very competent with the Internet and joked that he might pursue it more in earnest when he retired.

But he has nonetheless been leading us energetically and effectively. Long before he preached his first sermon, he had started "showing the way," as that dictionary definition of leadership puts it, with gestures like hopping the bus instead of the limo, forsaking a golden pectoral cross for his plain one, and stopping his pope-mobile to embrace a disabled man. We all got the message about what the Church should be about: be humble, be simple, take care of the poor and marginalized. ...

And his willingness to make choices that broke from tradition has already been influential, another element of great leadership. ... The pope had not issued a single directive to his team about lifestyle and may never have to. His actions may have spoken for him. That's leadership.

In a leadership-starved new century, the pope's approach seems incredibly well suited to the broader demands of leadership. If we commit to approach life and work similarly, we will lead effectively too.
